## Maritime Security Companies in Belgium

Ship owners and masters of vessels are primarily responsible for the protection of their ships against piracy. They must comply with the self-protection measures and best management practices (BMP 4) set by the international shipping industry.

The international community provides an important contribution to the security of international shipping in the Gulf of Aden and the waters east of Somalia with the permanent presence of naval vessels in the area.

Despite the protective measures and the presence of naval ships from Europe (EU NAVFOR) and from other countries such as China, India, Russia and the United States last year 34 vessels were attacked by pirates. For 5 vessels the attack was successful for the pirates. End 2012, more than 140 sailors were held hostage on the five vessels hijacked off the coast of Somalia.

It is a remarkable decrease compared to 2010 when 174 vessels were attacked and 47 hijacked effectively. The cause of this decline lies in several factors: better application of the self-protection (BMP 4) and the presence of armed private security guards aboard the ships.

The Belgian shipping companies insisted strongly on protection by armed personnel. A first solution with soldiers proved unfeasible, mainly because Belgium has no basis in the region and obtaining all necessary permissions to fly over armed soldiers from Belgium can take several weeks. This was insufficiently flexible as merchant ships only know a few days in advance with precision when they will sail through the danger zone.

Private security companies have already the necessary personnel and bases in the region and can provide the necessary flexibility. For example G4S International Maritime Solutions has permanently some fifty guards of EU origin in the region and has floating armories in the Red Sea and near the usual places where the security personnel boards / disembarks from the ships.

Belgian vessels in international waters are subject to Belgian law. For the deployment of armed security personnel, the Belgian legislation on private security needed adaptation. A new legal framework was necessary to admit licensed maritime security companies on ships flying the Belgian.

Since Jan 30, 2013 Belgian law created a new category of private security companies: the maritime security company ("maritieme beveiligingsonderneming") that can operate under strictly defined circumstances and in specific areas.

Geographically, the maritime security is only allowed in areas where there is a high risk of piracy. Currently, this is solely the Gulf of Aden and the waters east of Somalia, but other areas may be added later, if the risk is increased, for example, the Gulf of Guinea.

The security staff signs on as a seafarer and remains under the authority of the captain

The guards require therefore a seaman's book and the necessary maritime safety training (STCW 95).

They must be EU nationals and prove having performed during at least two years lawfully armed activities on board ships.

Only maritime security companies and security staff which are licensed by the Belgian authorities can be contacted by ship owners in of armed private protection.

## The Hague to Host ASIS Europe 2014

ASIS International and the City of The Hague have announced that the ASIS 13<sup>th</sup> European Security Conference & Exhibition will take place at the World Forum in The Hague, The Netherlands on 1-3 April 2014.
